
Mission

Our History

The parent organization of SOS Illinois started after World War II.

Due to the war, children were left without a home, without hope.

They were separated, often never seeing their siblings again; and foster care services at that point didn't offer much more than a roof over a head, but the founders of SOS Children's Villages International had a vision.

Instead of just finding a home for a child... build a home. Build villages.

Plus we have a lot of fun singing, dancing, playing games, and enjoying a meal together, as we are proud to celebrate the accomplishments of every child in our care.





















What Motivates Our Team?
